Investing in Community for the Sake of the Gospel

Shortly after we finished college, God opened our eyes to the needs of a Buddhist community that no one was trying to reach with the gospel. As we sought His direction, He connected us with other believers with a similar burden for these people, and we formed a team with the goal of seeing a church planted among them.

Since we began serving in the Far East in 2021, we have gotten to know the families in our building and where to get the best passion fruit ice cream. God has graciously prepared the path for us to build deep connections and have spiritual conversations—ones that we pray will lead to a group of believers gathering to worship.

The Lord has used the voices of our local friends to show us an opportunity to invest in our community by teaching English. With our teammates, we opened an English language school that enables us to serve our community in a tangible way and meet even more people.

A New Door in a Familiar Neighborhood

Our community has had very little access to the gospel, and we have the honor and responsibility of being the first Christians many people meet. We have invested in language learning so we can communicate in the heart language of the community, and as we have gained fluency, we've grown in our ability to clearly communicate the hope we have in Christ.

Sharing the gospel has been most effective in the context of relationships, and we're grateful for the friendships we've been able to build over shared meals and late-night conversations. This time has yielded relational capital and trust, and when we share about Jesus, our voices carry more and more weight.

As we prayed with our ministry partners and leadership about what to do after completing language learning, we started exploring business opportunities that would broaden our fishing ponds for the spiritually interested. This led us and our teammates to establish the Horizon English Institute. This school has given us a credible reason to live in our community and created access to broader circles of people seeking opportunities in the job market, and in many cases, something more.

In the Far East, English fluency carries significant social and economic weight. We have witnessed the investment families make into their children's language education as well as the career advancement available to adults who are proficient in this language. Our team spent a year surveying our city, received wise counsel from professionals locally and abroad, and ultimately determined that a language school would allow us to provide a service that's valued in our community while opening opportunities for the gospel. It has been a blessing to see how God has led and provided during this process.

Our Goals:

- Provide quality English instruction that opens doors for better employment opportunities
- Build our ministry team to expand our capacity and reach into the community
- Identify and begin investing in individuals who are spiritually open
- See people come to faith and a church of local believers established
